Questions to Ask Yourself:

- Do I want students to work collaboratively in creating and editing a body of work?
- Do I want each individual student to keep a diary of observations, reviews, or essays for other students to read and comment on?
- Do I want the ability to post course materials, such as PDFs or Word files for students to download?
- Do I want students to create a subject guide or reserve of frequently-asked questions?
- Do I want to be able to see who made changes to what and when? Do I want to keep old versions of material?
- Do I want a resource that can be used over multiple semesters or for multiple courses?
- Am I looking to create more conversation amongst the students over a series of constantly changing topics?
- How much effort do I want to put into learning and maintaining a resource?
